A veterinarian technician is a person who assists veterinarians with routine veterinary tasks and procedures. They are similar to a registered nurse in the human medical world. Veterinarian technicians are needed in many different avenues, including animal hospitals, zoos, and laboratories.

A veterinary technicians job duties may include;

- Preparing animals for examinations or surgery performed by the veterinarian
- Assisting veterinarians by restraining animals for exams or procedures such as X-rays
- Administering medications and vaccines
- Caring for and feeding animals under veterinary care or in a laboratory setting
- Assisting veterinarians during surgery
- Communicating veterinarian orders to patient owners

The veterinarian technician career field requires a minimum of an associates or equivalent two-year degree in an accredited veterinary technician program. Entry level veterinarian technicians often start off under the careful observation of a veterinarian. As vet techs gain experience and confidence, they are given more responsibilities under general supervision.

The veterinarian technician career field has the potential to provide a moderate living with a great job outlook. The field is expected to grow rapidly through 2018. Those who want to become veterinarian technicians must demonstrate patience when caring for injured, sick, and stressed animals that cannot control their reactions. Additionally, excellent written and verbal communication skills are crucial to success in this field.
